The 2K Cup and Mini racing is on the Saturday between 9.30 am and 3pm with rest of the weekend packed with other exciting activities including Roll up drag Racing, Power Cruise, Hot Rod Open testing , Classic car displays and a Tiger Moth Display. Be interesting to see planes using the runway in the centre of the track again.

Also happening this weekend on Sunday 12th is the Ellerslie Concours. HRC has a stand at the Ellerslie Concurs so come along and meet the team and see some interesting cars. We will have a McLaren, a Corvette, a Lightweight E Type Jaguar and a couple of other cars representing some of the classes that race with us on a regular basis.

The Great Lakes meeting has had a name change to Barry Algie Memorial Meeting and Historic Sports Sedans will be the feature class. Barry had a long history in Sports Sedans and was a great supporter of HRC. The Algie family have presented a cup for annual competition at this meeting.

HRC will be approaching classes over the next two months to book classes for next season's race meetings. Competitors should give some thought to race formats as a number of classes are looking at new formats. 2K Cup have had a lot of success with their two 33 minute format. Historic Sports Sedans are looking at shorter races but more of them and a variation on starts, standing, reverse standing, handicap and rolling. The Hooters Vintage Series is looking at a 2 lap sprint then stopping and doing another 2 lap sprint.

Hooters Vintage series is now gaining momentum. For those of you with an eye on NZ Historic Motorsport, the first 2 rounds have been a great success with several iconic NZ cars joining the action. If you remember the Roycroft Bugatti, Ralph Watsons BSA Special, Harold Heasley's Humber 80 that won the NZ Saloon car championship in 1959, the RA Vanguard etc, then this is the series for you !

The Formula Libre series over the Tasman Revival Series and Ken Smith festival was very successful and was oversubscribed and entries had to be rejected. Has been great to see the revival of Formula Pacific/Atlantic . Read the class coordinator (John Tomlin johntomlin@xtra.co.nz) report below Congratulations to David Glasson the winner of the famous Ken Wharton trophy and Carl Wall winner of the Ultimate Trophy. Both these trophies which date back to the Grand Prix at Ardmore and have many famous Formula One names on them have been made available to HRC Inc by The New Zealand International Grand Prix Association.

A number of members have enquired about MSNZ settling court action bought by V8 Supertourers and the effect it will have on MSNZ finances. HRC have written to the Chief Executive Officer Brian Budd requesting what the total payout was and the amount that was covered by insurance.

On Facebook recently there has been talk of where the New Zealand Grand Prix should be held as this the last year of the current contract which was awarded to Manfeild. For purely commercial reasons the Grand Prix should be held at Pukekohe or Hampton Downs as both tracks have the largest population with driving distance of the track and if you want commercial sponsorship/ corporate guests this is where MSNZ have to have it. Very few companies are going to take guests further south for a weekends entertainment. At present Pukekohe has better grandstand facilities but the track is too bumpy for the NZ Grandprix. Plans are under way to remove the bumps and reseal the track. Until that happens that just leaves Hampton Downs and with the addition of a few temporary grand stands it is an obvious venue.

Has Motorsport in New Zealand become a participant sport as opposed to a spectator sport?

Looking at traditional motor sport events this is definitely the case. To quote Eric Mallard from NZIGP and who has been involved since the great Ardmore days " Pre 1960 championship meeting drew crowds of 30 to 40,000 spectators, by the seventies this had dropped to 30,000 spectators, early eighties 15,000, Late eighties 10,000 and by the nineties it had dropped to an average of 5000 spectators " Over the last few seasons it has been a lot less.

The events drawing the big crowds have been Supers Cars (Australian Super Star drivers), Classic meetings like Skope, MG Meeting Manfeild, NZ Festival of Motor Racing, Whenuapai Wings and Wheels. Other events that are or have been successful are Nissan Mobil 500 (overseas series and overseas drivers), Hampton Downs & Highlands 101, Leadfoot (overseas stars and big variety of vehicles), Ellerslie Car Show, CRC SpeedShow, Beach Hop and Kumeu Car Show.

This shows if you want a crowd you need overseas stars or a wide variety of activities with a reasonably large promotions budget.





Formula Libre Series

So ends the eighth Festival of Motor Racing this time celebrating Kenny Smith. What a fantastic meeting as the Hampton Downs team did a great job. All the classes racing were full and I don't think anybody can deny the racing was the best we have seen in New Zealand this season. Now I know I am biased but the Formula Libre turned on the best racing of any class not only at the Festival but anywhere in New Zealand all four races were outstanding for the close racing right through the field but particularly at the front. More on that later but first a big congratulations to the series winners and place getters. Carl Wall from Christchurch took out the Ultimate Echo Trophy for single seaters with 463 points followed by a very deserving Garry Rush on 401 points. Both guys completing all three rounds. It gave me great pleasure to present the 3rd place to Geoff Harriman on 277 points having only competed in two rounds. Hopefully this result will encourage all the formula Holden's out of the garages next season.

In the Ken Wharton Trophy for Sports Cars 1st place went to David Glasson in the Juno with 483 points from a very happy Mike Limbrick in the Mallock U2 on 402 (big congrats Mike nobody can remember the last time a front engined car finished that high) and final place went to Tony Carruthers on 357 points. This is a particularly sweet result as you may remember Tony's car was completely burnt out on the first day of practice for last year's festival and this was Tony's first drive of it since.

Back to the racing and if it wasn't exciting enough that we had a capacity grid of 38 cars for the first time ever for Formula Libre, when the lights went out it was nothing short of outstanding with single seater new comer, James Watson out qualifying Kenny Smith and putting his Swift DB4 on the front row alongside Pole sitter Andrew Higgins. Unfortunately for James, Kenny had other ideas and he slipped into second place at the start and then took Andrew for the lead at the Porsche Dipper. At this stage it looked like business as usual and we all expected Kenny to run away and hide. However James Watson wanted to prove a point and tucked in behind the Maestro and slipped past Higgins at the same time. What then ensued was a spectacular dual as Kenny found he a real fight on his hands as James Watson drove around the outside of Kenny at Kev's Carousel (Turn 3) this battle continued

for about 3 laps until lap 4 when Watson was a little over enthusiastic coming off of the Double B corner in attempting a run on Smith into Hire Pool Hairpin and lost all the front aero as he was in the wash off Smiths Swift DB4's rear wing and ended up well of the track parked on the grass. Kenny went onto win from David Glasson in the Juno and a well-deserved 3rd for Garry Cooper in the ex-Craig Baird Reynard. Andrew Higgins came in next with a misbehaving Swift DB4 followed by eventual series winner Carl Wall in the John Sloane Engineering entered RF93 Reynard and rounding out the top six was Brett Willis in the Lola T332 Can Am car this entire group covered by less than 10 seconds.

The second race for the Libre's turned out to be not only the best Libre race it was arguably the best race of the entire festival with an epic six way fight for the lead! Once again this saw Kenny Smith eventuate as the winner after having to deal with an early charge by Watson. But the biggest threat came from David Glasson in the very fast 3.7 litre Zetec engined 2015 Juno sports prototype. Through the tight stuff Glasson was swamped by the Formula Atlantics with Garry (Green Tea) Cooper, Carl Wall and Andrew Higgins all getting past only to be repassed on the two fast straights from the Porsche Dipper back to the Start/Finish line. Higgins got by again to tuck in behind his good mate Smith. But yet another threat then appeared in the shape of Greg Thornton who somehow managed to get the officials to allow him onto the grid in the Lola 190 (two seater) Formula 5000. Not being allowed to run as an F5000 we are not sure this thing had a legit 5 litre stock block in it as it was an absolute rocket ship in a straight line. Like the Juno in the corners the Atlantics were too fast for it but on the straights Thornton got them back.

From the commentary position both Michael Clarke and myself were exhausted after calling this race as it was such an epic battle.

Amongst the other 30 competitors out there were some great battles going on all weekend especially between the Formula Fords, Andy Drummonds Alfa Ermoli & Tony Carruthers Swift sports car. Also there were some intense scraps going on between Geoff Harriman in the Ralt RT20, Garry Rush in the Swift DB4 and Travis Engen from the USA in his Ralt RT1 Formula Atlantic. Unfortunately Sundays weather and a few mechanical gremlins didn't produce the intensity of the previous days racing (just as well with a couple of late 50yo old commentators we may not have been able to handle it) but there were still some great dices going on.

It has to be said at this point with a massive amount of respect and admiration I give huge congratulations to Kenny Smith. Think about this not only did he win all four Formula Libre Races, He won all four Formula 5000 races and three of the Four Formula Ford races, finishing second in one of the after a clutch issue and winning the last one after starting from Pit Lane. Forget Kenny's age because as he says it is just a number, but the sheer talent to achieve this result is quite outstanding itself.

Well that is wrap up of the three round series for formula Libre and if this last three meetings is anything to go by next season is looking brilliant. We have formed a working group to plan meetings for next season with a more structured points system that will be class orientated to encourage more cars out of garages. We already have several additional Formula Atlantic drivers keen to get involved.

In the short term there are 4 meetings coming up that will have races for Formula Libre so please let me know if you are interested (no points) these will be:

Pukekohe 18th 19th Feb, Hampton 25th 26th March, Taupo 8th 9th April, Hampton 6th 7th May

In closing I would like to extend my personal thanks to each and every competitor, their teams and their families for entering and competing in Formula Libre over the last three rounds.
